

While program directors often have a clear understanding about applicants from Canadian medical schools, understanding an international graduate's application can be less clear.

The prevalence of urinary incontinence ranges between 17-55% among older women and 5-35% among older men. Incontinence is associated with impaired quality of life, poor self-rated health, social isolation, depressive symptoms and falls. The first step in managing urinary incontinence is to identify the type of incontinence through history, physical examination, a continence stress test and measurement of post-void residual urine volume. There are several effective behavioural management strategies that can be utilized to improve continence, including risk factor modification, pelvic floor muscle exercises, bladder training, prompted voiding and/or timed toileting. Urinary incontinence should not be managed with indwelling urinary catheters given their association with significant morbidity and mortality.




North Building - upper level












**FMF 2008 Revenue Breakdown**


