



# Teaching Tips: Ask Tell Ask

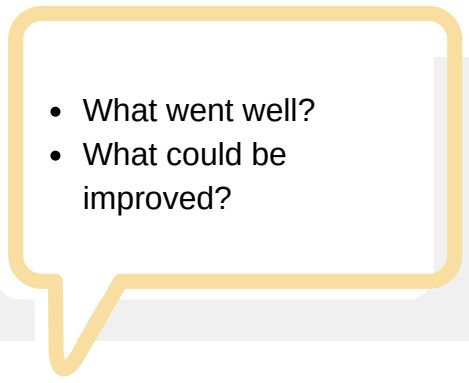


**Ask-Tell-Ask** is a learner-centered feedback approach that fosters learners' abilities to identify their own strengths and areas for improvement. This approach promotes learner accountability by facilitating the development of reflection and self-assessment skills. The bidirectional exchange of information creates a feedback conversation.



### Step 1: Ask

Ask the learner for their self-assessment and their perceptions of what went well and what could be improved.

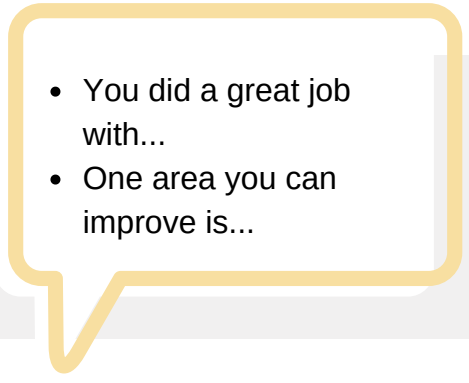


- What went well?

### Step 2: Tell

Tell the learner your opinion and acknowledge their concerns. Reinforce what the student did well and identify one area for improvement. Correct any mistakes.

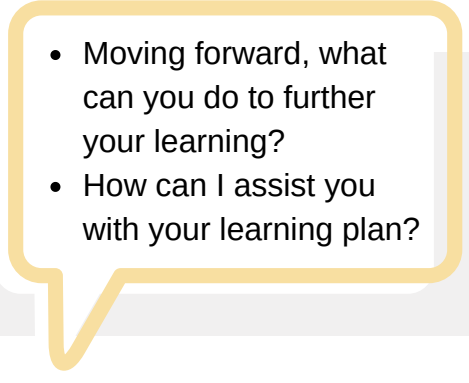


- You did a great job with...

### Step 3: Ask

Ask the learner for a plan to improve their performance. Clarify the learner's understanding of your feedback. Explore how you can assist them with their educational plan moving forward.

- How can I assist you with your learning plan?
